Network Concepts

In spring 2018, we received public input about top transportation and quality of life priorities: congestion relief, climate change and the environment, emerging technologies, healthy communities, housing, jobs, and the economy. With these priorities in mind, three network concepts have been developed for the public and SANDAG policymaker review and input.

The Shared Mobility, Connected Corridors, and Policy Possibilities network concepts were developed with the intent to provide travel choices, manage demand and enhance the transportation system, support goods movement and the economy, and consider impacts on social equity, the environment, and public health.

Public input on the network concepts will be used to develop draft scenarios for further review and input later this winter.
